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Hyatt Regency Hakone Resort and Spa

Hyatt Regency Hakone is located in Gora, away from the bustle of Hakone's central *onsen* district. The hotel's design concept is of a private mountain lodge. All 79 rooms are spacious, including the nine suites that cover more than 80 square meters each. Room rates range from JPY 43,900 to 121,300 for double occupancy; a charge of JPY 8,100 applies for each additional guest. Six dog-friendly rooms are also available for guests with canine friends. The Living Room lounge situated in the center of the hotel is a magnificent space of plush armchairs around a large fireplace, where guests can enjoy afternoon tea, aperitifs, and after-dinner drinks just as they would at home. The Dining Room restaurant serves



French country cooking, using fresh local ingredients and fish from nearby Suruga and Sagami bays.

The Spa Izumi has eight treatment rooms: each has a walk-in mist sauna and a shower, and four rooms also have bathtubs. The spa uses its original organic kiwi, raspberry, and blueberry seed oils for body treatments and the Yon-ka line of skin-care products, developed in the '50s by two French botanist brothers, for facials. A soak afterward in the hot spring enhances the effect of the spa treatments.

Fujiya Hotel Hakone

Cherry trees on the sprawling grounds of Fujiya Hotel bloom all at once, as if hurrying to rejoice in the arrival of spring to the hills of Hakone. This year marks the 130th spring for Fujiya Hotel Hakone. During its long and celebrated history, the hotel has received many foreign dignitaries, as commemorated by its collection of VIP plates.

Special-edition plates of those included in the VIP collection will be used to serve dinner for the "Flower Palace" package, which offers a one-night stay at the delightful Flower Palace and two meals. Rates start at JPY 26,000 per person, double occupancy. The "Basic Stay Internet" package is also quite tempting. It includes a one-night stay and American-style



breakfast in the main dining room: rates run from JPY 10,700 in a Standard Twin room and from JPY 14,900 in a Forest Lodge Deluxe Twin room (41 square meters). Basic Stay Internet packages are available for 10 rooms per day, and limited to reservations made through the Internet. Both Flower Palace and Basic Stay Internet packages are available through March 31.

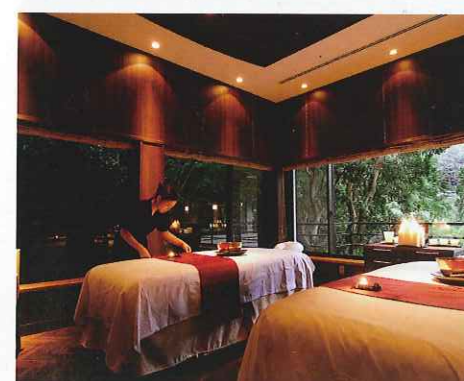

Tsubaki

At Tsubaki, the Zen-style spa Ichirin aims to restore balance to your body, mind, and spirit. A therapist helps you select and design a treatment menu that will best suit your specific needs of the day. Select treatments from the four base menus, including facials, body treatments, and signature treatments, to combine into your own specific menu for 2 hours (JPY 30,000), 3 hours (JPY 45,000), or 6 hours (JPY 90,000). All treatments begin with the Zen ritual of sounding a singing bowl, which vibrates the air and helps you better connect with your inner self.

The most notable treatment is the Carita Rénovateur facial that uses a sunflower-seed-based gommage cream. Applied with a



delicate hand technique by a highly trained therapist, this exfoliation treatment rejuvenates, hydrates, and renews your skin.

The signature treatment includes shirodhara, an ancient Indian therapy of dripping warm oil onto your forehead (location of the "third eye") to slowly relieve your body, mind, and soul of tension. At Ichirin, *tsubaki* (camellia) oil is used.

After enjoying deep relaxation at Ichirin in the midst of beautiful nature, you can sample the new menu, "Kaiseki Ichirin," at the Kaiseki Tsubaki restaurant.
